

ORDINANCE NO. 516

CITY OF DETROIT LAKES, MINNESOTA

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 700 OF THE DETROIT LAKES CODE,
SECTION 702 LIQUOR AND WINE LICENSING**

The City Council of the City of Detroit Lakes Ordains:

1) Section 702.02 Subd. 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Subd. 2. On-Sale Liquor Licenses. "On-sale" liquor licenses shall be issued to hotels, motels, restaurants and bowling centers, and shall permit "on-sale" of liquor only. Any restaurant licensed hereunder must have a minimum seating capacity of 90 in its formal dining area. Any hotel-motel licensed hereunder must have a minimum seating capacity of 90 in its formal dining area and have at least 60 rooms available for guests.

2) Section 702.02 Subd. 3 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Subd. 3. On-Sale Wine Licenses. "On-sale wine" licenses shall be issued to restaurants meeting the qualifications of M.S. 340A.404, Subd. 5, and shall permit only the sale of wine not exceeding fourteen percent (14%) alcohol by volume, for consumption on the licensed premises only, in conjunction with the sale of food. Any restaurant licensed hereunder shall have seating capacity for no fewer than 25 guests at one time.

3) Section 702. Subd. 10 of the City Code is hereby added as follows:

The city may issue an on-sale intoxicating liquor license, an on-sale wine license, or an on-sale malt liquor license to a convention center within the city, notwithstanding any law, local ordinance, or charter provision. A license issued under this paragraph authorizes sales on all days of the week to persons attending events at the convention center.

4) Section 702. Subd. 11 of the City Code is hereby added as follows:

The city may issue an on-sale wine license and an on-sale malt liquor license to a person who is the owner of a summer collegiate league baseball team or baseball team competing in a league established by the Minnesota Baseball Association, or to a person holding a concessions or management contract with the owner, for beverage sales at a ballpark or stadium located within the city for the purposes of summer collegiate league baseball games, town ball games, and any other events at the ballpark or stadium, notwithstanding any law, local ordinance, or charter provision. A license issued under this paragraph authorizes sales on all days of the week to persons attending baseball games and any other events at the ballpark or stadium.

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by Law.
